- CCL is a journal of criticism review which deals with young adult and children's literature. It offers:
 - Criticism that examines Canadian children's literature from its beginning to the present
 - In-depth reviews of recently published Canadian books for young children and adolescents
 - Interviews with Canadian writers and illustrators
 - Occasional reprints of old historical materials and stories
 - Annual and specialized bibliographies
 - Special issues which focus on such topics as the Canadian animal story, the novels of L.M. Montgomery, the papers of the Loughborough International Seminar on Canadian children's literature, drama for Canadian children, and fantasy

Past issues have included articles on:

Morley Callaghan's novel, Luke Baldwin's Vow; R.M. Ballantyne's Canadian stories; Gabrielle Roy's vision of childhood; Canadian reference and informational materials for children's libraries; Sir Charles Roberts' animal stories; the use of fantasy in L.M. Montgomery's novels; satire and realism in Anne of Green Gables; the picture book in Quebec; Catharine Parr Traill's writing for children; Farley Mowat's novels for young people; the character of the wolf in children's literature; Pierre Berton's fantasy, The Secret World of Og; early Canadiana in the Osborne Collection of Early Children's Books; children's literature in French Canada; the cultural resurgence of Canada's native peoples.

Interviews with or articles by the following well-known Canadian authors/illustrators have also appeared: Jean Little, Claude Aubry, Ruth Nichols, Elizabeth Cleaver, Roderick Haig-Brown, and Margaret Laurence.

CCL's contributors have included teachers, librarians, writers, editors, journalists, illustrators, and scholars from many fields—a cosmopolitan and cross-disciplinary group with a shared interest in what children read.
