from the time of the Dinosaurs By Erna Dirks Rowe and Alan Daniel

The dinosaurs were not alone in their vast world. In the oceans, forests and air around them lived many other strange creatures: *Archaeopteryx*, a feathered, crow-sized animal, half-reptile, half-bird; *Kronosaurus*, the greatest giant sea reptile, longer than a cabin cruiser, with jaws that could hold a rowboat; *Meganeura*, a dragonfly with a wingspread wider than a seagull's; *Pachydiscus*, a huge, squidlike creature that could outswim and outfight almost any fish in the sea.

Flying and Swimming Creatures from the time of the Dinosaurs shows how these creatures lived, what they looked like and also what it would be like if they were living today. Alan Daniel's superb full-colour illustrations are breathtakingly lifelike, and Erna Dirks Rowe's text is simple, vivid and often whimsical.
