Round table: responses, notes and queries

Margery Fee misses the sense of moral ambiguity in *Hockeybeat Harris* (see review *CCL* #43 page 60-1) and leaves your readers with the impression that the book is a crude anti-German diatribe. The book questions the morality of bombing (ours as well as theirs). Bob discovers levels of rage within himself that are frightening to him and reveal that there is evil in us as well as in them. When a discussion of "our" failings in Canadian refugee policy is introduced, Fee dismisses it as implausible because it reflects attitudes of 1980 not 1940. There were people, even in Saskatoon in 1940, who protested against those policies. Bob's concern is personal; Mackenzie King's letter as discussed in the book, was abstract and political. If Fee finds it "nauseating" that adults should offer support and understanding to a frightened child far from home, she lives in a bleaker world than many of us.
